

The Greene Township Board of Supervisors held its regular meeting on Tuesday, March 24, 2026, at the Greene Township Municipal Building, 1145 Garver Lane, Chambersburg, PA 17202.

Present: Todd Burns, Travis Brookens, and Shawn Corwell, Supervisors; Kurt Williams, Solicitor; Daniel Bachman, Zoning Officer; Gina Griffith, Secretary.

The Chairman called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m., announced that the meeting was being recorded for accuracy, and requested that visitors sign in.

The minutes of the regular meeting held March 10, 2026, shall stand approved as presented and become part of the official record.

The Chairman opened the floor for public comment. None was offered.

Supervisor Corwell presented Supplement #3 for the Kohler and Walker Road traffic signal project. The scope of work is for a Signal System Plan Analysis. The Borough completed an analysis of its signals and timing and provided it to the Township for the proposed signal at Walker and Kohler Roads. HRG will also do an analysis in the Township and compare the results with the Borough's study to ensure accurate and coordinated signal timing, and the cost to perform that analysis will be \$13,970.00. On a motion by Supervisor Brookens, seconded by Supervisor Corwell, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted to approve Supplement #3 for the Kohler and Walker Road traffic signal as presented.

Supervisor Corwell reported that the Township provides semi-annual donations to the four fire companies serving the Township. The allocation is based on population at a rate of \$8.00 per resident. Fayetteville Fire Company will receive \$38,768.00, along with an apparatus donation of \$10,000.00. Franklin Fire Company will receive \$29,140.00, with an additional \$10,000.00 for apparatus. Due to smaller service populations, Pleasant Hall and West End Fire Companies will each receive \$8,000.00, along with apparatus donations of \$5,000.00 each. Supervisor Corwell noted that all four companies submitted the required documentation detailing the prior year's use of funds, thereby meeting the Township's funding requirements. On a motion by Supervisor Brookens, seconded by Supervisor Corwell, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted to release the semi-annual fire company donations and annual apparatus donations as presented.

Supervisor Brookens recommended releasing the annual donations budgeted for local youth organizations that operate facilities within the Township and sponsor little league and football programs, as well as for the Ragged Edge Swim Club. The organizations include Guilford Hills, Fayetteville, Greenvillage, and Scotland. Each organization is budgeted to receive \$7,000.00 annually for the maintenance and operation of their facilities, and \$1,500.00 is budgeted for the Ragged Edge Swim Club. On a motion by Supervisor Corwell, seconded by Supervisor Brookens, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted to release the annual recreation donations for 2026 as presented.

Supervisor Corwell provided an update on the Fayetteville fire engine purchase. He explained that the Township previously provided a donation of \$500,000.00 toward the purchase of an engine tanker and, upon receipt of the invoice, the funds were remitted directly to the manufacturer. The Township was notified that while the payment was sent to the correct manufacturer, it was applied to the incorrect vehicle. Fayetteville has two vehicles on order, and the Township's contribution should have been applied to the first engine rather than the engine tanker for grant purposes, and this adjustment ensures eligibility for the LSA grant for the engine tanker.

The Chairman recommended advertising the receipt of sealed bids for the following contracts: bituminous materials, crushed aggregate and paving and equipment rental. On a motion by Supervisor Corwell, seconded by Supervisor Brookens, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board unanimously voted to advertise the receipt of sealed bids for the following 2026 contracts: bituminous materials, crushed aggregate and paving and equipment rental; bids to be received no later than April 27, 2026 at 3:00 pm and opened at the regular meeting on April 28, 2026 at 12:00pm at the Greene Township Municipal Building (1145 Garver Lane, Chambersburg, PA 17202).

In reference to the Presentation of PEMA Certification item on the Agenda, Supervisor Corwell stated that there was a scheduling conflict, and the presentation was postponed until April 28, 2026.

The Zoning Officer presented for consideration a review time extension for the Woodland Supply Final Land Development Plan located off Sunset Pike. The Board received correspondence from Lance Kegerreis of Dennis Black Engineering requesting the extension. The current deadline is April 5, 2026, and the applicant is requesting an extension through July 5, 2026. On a motion by Supervisor Corwell, seconded by Supervisor Brookens, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board voted to grant the review time extension for the Woodland Supply Final Land Development Plan, extending the deadline from April 5, 2026, to July 5, 2026, as presented.

On a motion by Supervisor Brookens, seconded by Supervisor Corwell, and by a vote of 3-0, the Board voted to approve and authorize the payment of invoices as follows: check numbers 1053 through 1073 and three ACH transactions to be paid from the general fund, check numbers 1001 through 1005 to be paid from the liquid fuels fund, and check number 1004 to be paid from the electric light fund.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting at 12:15 pm.
